Introduction and definitions

What is child exploitation?

Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) happens when an individual or group takes advantage of a power imbalance (like age, gender or social status) to sexually abuse a child or young person (CYP).

- CYP may be given something **tangible** like money, clothes or drugs by the abuser.
- CYP may be given something **intangible** – like love, protection or attention by the abuser.
- The abuser may receive **financial gain or increased status** because of the abuse.

Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE) happens when an individual or group takes advantage of a power imbalance (like age, gender or social status) to force a child or young person to become involved in criminal activity.

- The abuser may use violence or threat of violence.
- CYP may be given something **tangible** like money, clothes or drugs by the abuser.
- CYP may be given something **intangible** – like love, protection or attention by the abuser.
- The abuser may receive **financial gain or increased status** because of the abuse.

It is never a child or young person's fault if they are abused or exploited and both boys and girls are affected.

Why should my business care about it?

Anyone under the age of 18 in England is a child and businesses working in the evenings and through the night may have either a social or legal responsibility to ensure children are kept safe from harm.

Businesses across London can spot signs of a child or young person being exploited and with the right knowledge they can prevent, disrupt or protect them from harm.

Businesses working in the evenings and through the night should have a basic understanding of what to look out for to ensure exploitation isn't occurring in or nearby their businesses and know what to do if they spot it.

What do I need to do?

If you are concerned about a child's immediate safety or welfare **call the police on 999**.

If it is not an emergency, or you have on-going concerns, **call police on 101 to make a report**.

You can also call Crimestoppers anonymously on $0800\ 555\ 111$ or the NSPCC helpline on $0808\ 800\ 5000.$




Hotels


Licensed Venues






Free Training for London Businesses
